Sectio Latina Pre-Congress Course on the work of Boethius *De consolatione Philosophiae*
Tuesday, October 3, from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. and from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m., Argentina time

Aim

It seeks to present, in 5 sessions, a prolegomenon around the work of Boethius *De consolatione Philosophiae*. The aforementioned workshop is intended to refer the participant to some fragments of this work in its original language, so each of the lessons will be fully exposed in Latin. Likewise, the comments, questions and answers will be in Latin.

The following points will be exposed:

- Structure of the writing
- Delimitation of the main conjugated concepts in *De consolatione Philosophiae*
- Philosophia -- *Liberum arbitrium* -- Deus -- Fortune
- Understanding of the relationship between the tropological substrate and the philosophical exposition.

Schedule

Tuesday, October 3 from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. and from 3 to 6 p.m. (from Argentina).

The program is divided into 5 sessions of one hour each.

- a) **First session, Liber Primus:** *Philosophia et vita beata*
- b) **First session, Liber secundus:** *De fortuna fatoque*
- c) **Second session, Liber tertius:** *De consolatione Dei*
- d) **Second session, Liber quartus:** *De origine vitii*
- e) **Second session, Liber quintus:** *De libero arbitrio*
